# **MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA**

On 22-23 October, 2016 at the Pallotine Centre in Kew, 40 people gathered to fulfill a desire that each one of them had. For some it was curiosity to know a little more about this mystic. For others, it was a desire to share in a comfortable environment with others without feeling the need to justify themselves or feel defensive about their love of these works. Yet for others, it was an opportunity to meet other people – real people, not just names – who loved Maria's works too. People came from Tasmania, from city and country Victoria, from New South Wales, from Queensland and from New Zealand. There is no denying that although we were all strangers from a social perspective, we were not strangers on a spiritual level because from the very start, we certainly felt like kindred

spirits. We knew our own. Such joy! Apparently, it was a very cold, rainy, gusty Melbourne weekend with hailstones at one point and only a momentary ray of sunshine here and there. However, I can honestly say that I am one of the few that knew what was going on outside the walls of this beautiful historic building because we were all so absorbed in being together to share, that we had no reason to be concerned with the goings-on outside.

Each day's program began with a Mass. Fr. David Lemewu was once a MV Readers Group member at our monthly meetings before he got the call to become a priest. In fact, a few of us were at his ordination a couple of months before. What a blessing to have him say Mass for us. We certainly did not have to explain anything about Maria to him. He felt the love for her writings too. It was a beautiful Mass with a meaningful and engaging homily, not to mention his extraordinary singing ability!

Those who gathered were greeted with a gift bag containing the "necessary tools" needed for the day. It contained the program, rosary beads for this Month of the Rosary (lovingly sent by the Bove family from Western Australia & blessed by Fr. David Lemewu after Mass), a Mercy & Justice Booklet with excerpts from the writings of Maria Valtorta in this Jubilee Year of Mercy, a MV bookmark to commemorate the Conference, a prayer card for the canonisation of Maria Valtorta, and a DVD of Stephen Austin's talk to help confirm and validate our love for these works and our choice to read them so we can grow in faith. There was also a booklet of passages from Maria's writings to read and share within our small-group sessions.

Guest speakers consisted of Johnny Cantarella, Rosemarie Lennox and David Murray who shared their heartfelt testimonies. Stephen Austin sent a recorded talk on the astronomical and geographical authenticity of Maria's works, Patrick Jee spoke on the success and, at times, difficulties in attempting to reach out and spread Maria's works on social media.

As Sr. Christine Kabumbu from Zambia did not receive the necessary travel documentation in time (only 4 days out), she still sent her talk which was presented on the day. How we truly missed her. Finally, there was my own presentation of excerpts from Marta Diciotto's book *Una Vita Con Maria Valtorta* (*Life with Maria Valtorta*) which has not yet been translated into English.

There were two opportunities available daily for people to meet in small groups, read passages aloud and share their personal response. This gave us all a chance to get together, get to know one another spiritually and reflect on the writings too. Not to mention that the tea/coffee and lunch breaks gave us more time to chat or browse books. But let's face it, most people were avid readers — they already had *The Poem of the Man-God* or *The Gospel as Revealed to Me*, so they were interested in The *Notebooks* primarily, and other booklets that they could share with friends back home.

We also prayed a decade of the rosary interspersed with relevant passages from the works (from *Praying the Rosary with Maria Valtorta*), the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and we listened to the audio reading of the canonised Sunday Gospel followed by the Maria Valtorta equivalent. # VIAREGGIO, ITALY

A successful Maria Valtorta International Congress took place in Italy on Saturday 22 and Sunday 23 October. It was held in Viareggio, which is a few kilometres from Maria Valtorta's house. This was the first of its kind organised by the Italian Maria Valtorta Foundation. Two hundred and fifty people who are avid readers gathered at this wonderful event. The material presented over these two days came from the work of students, scientists and priests. etc. Guest speakers included specialists, Tom Dube and Stephen Austin; Spanish theologian Ruben Esteban Pineda, and many other Italian specialists in their fields, who presented the latest findings and who always continue to be amazed by the historical miracle of the Valtorta phenomenon. France was represented by Mr. Bruno Perrinet, the President of the French Foundation, who talked about the history and the different activities of the Association.

"The International Valtorta Conference in Italy went very well! It was fantastic meeting Valtorta researchers from around the world and seeing so many people who are Valtorta fans or are seriously interested in her. There were so many talks on such a variety of Valtorta topics: I highly recommend that readers watch many of them once they are uploaded. Many were presented by professors or experts in various fields, and many of them are relevant to my research (Ed: which Stephen will include when he updates his Summa). One of the speakers resolved four historical facts in Valtorta's work

that seemed like a contradiction to the mainstream thought of history (for example, the mention of Galen) and he did an excellent and thorough job resolving these apparent errors/contradictions.

She wrote two excellent articles about the conference and published them on Zenit (a popular international news organisation based in Rome). The first article is an excellent Questions & Answers interview with Don Zucchini (the priest who is in charge of the Maria Valtorta Foundation and who was behind this conference). The second article was a follow-up article summarising the conference and it was fantastic! The journalist even mentions my Maria Valtorta Summa & Encyclopedia in it, among other things. # **PARIS, FRANCE**

A very successful first *National Day of Friends of Maria Valtorta* took place on 28 May, 2016 in Paris. There were 450 people present at the one-day Conference. Here is a letter written by Agnès Buet.

"I had the joy of participating in the first National Day on the writings of Maria Valtorta on Saturday, 28 May in the 16<sup>th</sup> district of Paris. I also had the joy of having my husband with me in the afternoon.

In the morning, I arrived around 9:20 at the Chapel of St. Bernadette, in the Parisian district of Auteuil. To enter the main chapel, you have to descend a flight of stairs. At the bottom, there is a mosaic of the apparitions [of Our Lady] to Bernadette. [So] there was Mary, our Mother, who welcomed us!

We started the day by entrusting it to [Jesus]. We prayed the Joyful, Sorrowful and only four of the Glorious mysteries of the Rosary because it was time for Mass, which was concelebrated by three priests, including Father Yannik Bonnet.

After Mass, those who registered were invited to the Chasseloup Room (about 50 metres down the road) for lunch. It was also a time to get acquainted and share information. Due to an influx of registrations, we were not

served a hot lunch, but sandwiches at a cost priced for the 70 people present.

I found myself seated opposite a person who used to live near my parents, and she knew the Abbess of a neighbouring convent very well! Meanwhile, the person on my left discovered the writings of Maria Valtorta in an extraordinary way: he heard a voice say something in his ear, so then he did a search on the internet! This calls for humility and to recognise the greatness of the Lord who acts as He pleases.

After lunch, we were invited to walk about 150 metres to the Notre Dame Church in Auteuil, which was much larger than the room that welcomed us. Indeed, there were more than 400 people registered!

I found my husband (thank you mobile phone) and listened to Bruno Perrinet who introduced the speakers. The first told us about the accuracy of the details described by Maria Valtorta in her writings: he was in awe of the "impossible" human knowledge about the Palestinian, Hebrew, Greek and Roman world at the time of Christ. All recent scientific discoveries in archaeology, history and astronomy, extraordinarily confirm the writings of Maria Valtorta. As the speaker said: 'This proof is given in the same way as it was given to Saint Thomas: for he is the one who "touched" Jesus in order to believe just as we now also "touch" scientific evidence!'

The testimony of the final speaker, Father Yannik Bonnet really touched us. His discovery of Valtorta as a layman, at a time when his wife was suffering from cancer, helped him a great deal to be there for his children when she died and for sometime later. After becoming a priest, these books also helped him with his pastoral care of the faithful. By giving us some practical examples of the characters described by Valtorta, he showed us how Jesus, who was very respectful of everyone, always reacted appropriately to requests or to the sufferings [of the people] He met. It is therefore a valuable aid to his priestly ministry. Valtorta, being able to acutely analyse people, recounts visions with which she was rewarded very well and she sometimes recounts them with humour. After these deep and moving moments, we returned to the Chasseloup room for a chance to gather, purchase books and meet the authors.

For me, who always felt quite alone because I was the only one in my circle of friends to read Valtorta, it was very important to meet these Christians here from all backgrounds, who had a good head on their shoulders, and who were down-to-earth people that loved these books.

Will Valtorta be finally recognised and measured by her contribution to the Church and to the people of our time?" (Translated from French by Catherine Loft from the French Valtorta website.

[Ed: According to Marta, Maria did have an ardent desire for the works to be approved by the Church and published in order to save so many souls, but Maria asked the Lord for only one favour - not to give her any external visible signs, neither before nor after her death. When Maria's body was exhumed in 1973, Father Berti was disappointed that there were no extraordinary signs, such as the body being intact – incorrupt. However, Marta never expected anything because Maria herself had told her about her request. This explains not only the absence

of the stigmata, even though Maria felt all the pains of the Passion, but also the fact that the corpse did not remain incorrupt, which would have made it less difficult to open her cause for beatification. The only outward sign of her participation in the Passion was a bruise on her back that lasted for years, which was one of the blows from the scourging. (This remained until her death, without ever healing). There may have been no stigmata and no incorrupt remains but even at her death, there was a small miracle, a clue: the right hand with which Maria wrote remained intact until the burial, while the left and the rest of her body already showed signs of perishing. Furthermore, at the opening of the tomb, her hair was grey, but when cleaned, her hair returned to the blonde colour of her youth. (from Una Vita con Maria Valtorta. Life with Maria Valtorta.
